# NJ State orders Horizon to pay chiropractors' claims

The Association of New Jersey Chiropractors said Monday that the state Department of Banking & Insurance has ruled the state's largest health insurer must end its practice of not paying the separate claims of chiropractors for patient exams and physical therapies.

The association said Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield had been bundling the claims into reimbursements for general chiropractic treatment, subjecting them to the limits of single claims and effectively denying them.

DOBI Commissioner Neil N. Jasey issued a cease and desist order Oct. 7, directing Horizon to treat chiropractors' claims the same way as other health care provider claims. "The fact that in other disciplines, comparable services are billed separately and compensated separately is probative (i.e., proof) on the question of whether Horizon's blanket policy of including multiple services performed by a licensed chiropractor in a single visit in one 'global fee' for (chiropractic manipulative treatment) services is appropriate," Jasey wrote in his order.

Horizon had been denying the claims for exams and physical therapies since 1997, when it switched its claim codes, according to Jeffrey Randolph, the lead attorney for the Association of N.J. Chiropractors.

Right to Diagnose Challenged in Texas

The Texas Medical Association has challenged the right of Texas chiropractors to diagnose (in addition to seeking to disallow Manipulation Under Anesthesia and Needle EMG by chiropractors), saying that only medical doctors have the right to diagnose patients. Litigation is ongoing, with the next trial date (regarding constitutional claims) scheduled for January 19th, 2010, but the outcome has the potential to eventually affect other states beyond Texas.

## House Passes Medicare Physician Payment Reform Act

The U.S. House of Representatives have passed H.R. 3961--the Medicare Physician Payment Reform Act of 2009. H.R. 3961 repeals the current Medicare physician payment formula--the sustainable growth rate (SGR)-- and replaces it with a new framework. The vote was 243-183. The majority were Democrats although Michael Burgess, MD, (R-TX), was the sole Republican to vote for passage.

Under H.R. 3961, the SGR would be replaced with a new formula in which only physician services, and not other services provided incidentally to a physician visit (such as laboratory services or drugs), would be counted in each category; the update for 2010 would be the percentage increase in the Medicare economic index (MEI), which is 1.2 percent; and the new SGR formula would take into account spending for each category of service since 2009 or, beginning in 2014, for the previous five years.

Beginning in 2011, there would be separate target growth rates and conversion factor updates for two categories of service: evaluation, management, and preventive services (services to grow at GDP plus 2% per year), and all other services (to grow at the rate of GDP plus 1% per year). In addition, the legislation allows Accountable Care Organizations (groups of physicians and possibly hospitals responsible for quality and overall annual Medicare spending for their patients) to have their own expenditure

targets and updates for such practitioners, aside from reductions or increases applying elsewhere.
